Village of Richmond



Richmond was platted in 1844 by Charles Cotting and Theodore Purdy. It is situated on sections 9 and 16, and is on the banks of Nippersink Creek. The same year the village was platted, Messrs. Cotting and Purdy built a gristmill (Doyle's Pub), and at its frame raising (a great event in those days) the offer was made by its owners that whoever climbed to the top of the building could have the naming of the new village. Isaac M. Reed reached the top of the building and named the place Richmond, after a favorite town of his in Vermont. At first this township was named Montelona, but later took that of Richmond.
